

My favorite technique and medium of drawing and painting?

My favorite technique of drawing would definitely be digital. I have access to all kinds of brushes and it's so easy to use, and no messes and clean-up. However, when not doing digital, I love messes and clean-up. However, when not doing digital, I love using watercolor and pencil.

2. How do you get inspired to produce a piece of artwork?

Inspiration for creating art isn't the easiest. I typically think about it for a while, look at images for inspiration, then jump in and draw, over and over again until it feels like I'm on the right track. It usually doesn't flow well until the image I'm trying to draw finally comes out. Once it does, everything about it feels right. That's how I know it's what I want.

4. What do you do to overcome a creative block?

Overcoming a creative block is not easy. For one, my biggest is distractions and not letting me work. I have to be focused and ready to sit and let it flow. When I get 2 min to sit and interrupted over and over I have to stop. It's almost like conditions have to be perfect. So yeah, it's not easy working from home as an illustrator with 4 kiddos. However, If I can sit and focus for hours I can get past distractions and let it flow.

5. When did you start illustrating?

Around 6th grade, I remember thinking I wanted to be an artist when I grew up. I went to art school in college but was overwhelmed with the thought of supporting myself as an artist. So instead I did watercolors and other mediums as a hobby, then a small business selling customs artwork. It wasn't until 2018 when a new author friend took a chance on an intimidated artist and pushed me past my boundaries, showing me the talent I didn't think I had.

6. What does art mean to you?

To me, art means expression. It's a way to talk and show beauty and talent with imagery not expressed in a spoken language. It's going deep into the inner mind and pulling out beauty one can see within and how they may express that thought.
